FOCUS ON MISSIONS

Sunday, April 4th was a great day of the first year anniversary celebration of Siempre Familia Iglesia de Cristo. There were over 250 in attendance. The Lord has blessed Siempre Familia with 36 baptisms since its beginning in April 2009. In addition, over the week of May 12th when the youth went to Houston to a Youth Meeting, 9 were baptized. They use to meet in the fellowship hall at the building, but have now moved to the 1,000 seat auditorium as they now have 150-160 people each Sunday. Their Tuesday night Bible study has some 65-75 in attendance. They have 50-60 children attending the services and Bible study weekly and have around 30 people, 10-18 years old. It has been noted that a Chilean, North American, Central American, South American and the Caribbean people are represented in Siempre Familia. Praise the Lord! It is amazing how God is bringing all these nations into one body of believers to praise His name united in Christ! As part of the strategy at Siempre Familia, they want to be an Extremely Focused Church and one of the first projects they want to implement is ESL classes for their community. They have started a pilot program to learn what it takes to run a successful ESL Program, select the right material, and train teachers and volunteers among other things. They hope to offer the ESL classes beginning in August 2010. They also have developed a relationship with the Roger Wilson Elem. School which has impressed the principal. Some of the families from the school have had counseling with the team members at Siempre Familia. Their goal is to serve the community by showing the grace and love of Jesus.
